**Lime kilns in the landscape: developing styles - a guided excursion with
David Johnson**

- 9.00 am (prompt) Leave Lancaster University from **Farrer Avenue** (adjacent to University Sports Centre). Please note - this is a Visitors Only Car Park - and you will need to display a parking ticket which will cost approx. £3 for the whole day.
- 9.45 am **Alternatively**, park in Ingleton and meet the rest of the party at Ingleton Falls. The whole party will visit the Waterfalls Café for coffee/tea and a traybake (included in the fee).
- 10.25 am From the Waterfalls Café we will walk to Mealbank Quarry (approx. 400m each way on a level, tarred road; please note: although the kiln is basically level underfoot, there may be some trip hazards, however, there are no ascents/descents).
- 11.05 am Depart Ingleton (travelling via Ribbleshead), briefly stopping en route to look (from the coach) at a clamp kiln and an early-modern field kiln.
- 12.25 pm Arrive in Settle. You may wish to bring a packed lunch and eat it in Settle, or you can purchase a sandwich in the town (lunch is not included in the fee for the day).
- 1.30 pm Depart Settle for a short journey on to the Craven Lime Works.
- 1.40 pm Arrive at Craven Lime Works (Depending on where the coach is able to park there will be a walk of approx. 350m at start and finish of the visit on a tarred road; there will then be an ascent going in for approx. 150m. This is followed by two flights of very rough (rustic) stone steps, with rope handrail. It is dark in places within the kiln and you are advised to bring a small torch.)
- 3.45 pm Depart Craven Lime Works
- 4.15 pm Arrive at Ingleton for drop off and brief toilet stop.
- 4.45 pm (prompt) Depart Ingleton for travel back to Lancaster University.
- 5.30 pm approx. Arrive at Lancaster University.

Fee: £24.00 (£23.00 for Friends of the Centre)
Fee includes: Coach Travel; all Guide and Tuition Fees, Coffee/Tea & Cake at Waterfalls Café, Ingleton, but does not include lunch. Please wear suitable footwear for uneven terrain, and bring waterproof clothing/umbrellas, and if possible, a small torch.
